



David Goldstone Youth & Diversity Scholarships

The **Rotary Club of Crawley** is passionate about supporting and developing socially conscious leaders of the future through its **David Goldstone Youth & Diversity Scholarships**. The scholarships are named in honour of the late David Goldstone, whose vision and belief in the potential of youth led to their establishment. The scholarships offer the opportunity to participate in a unique leadership program – a Rotary first!

This is not your 'run of the mill' leadership program. This is about supporting young people, students, business professionals, Indigenous Australians and individuals with disabilities to develop leadership capacities and to give back to the community and we have just the right people, program, networks and support to do it.

WHO ARE WE

The Rotary Club of Crawley (or ROC for short) has set out is a modern club with a difference and, since its inception in 2010, has already set new benchmarks in Australia and overseas!

We offer opportunities to develop interpersonal, leadership, and project management skills, and to enjoy the shared experiences of networking, social activities and mentoring with business and community leaders.

We already have a core of young members aged 20 – 40 years, and an average age about **20 years less than most Rotary Clubs!** We wish to encourage even greater diversity, including sectors of the community who do not usually have access to these opportunities. This scholarship is intended for young adults on the threshold of their careers.

We are a club firmly implanted in the 21st Century, understanding the time and financial constraints of modern living, and creating an environment of leadership and community in which everyone can contribute.

More than that, we have fun!

WHAT WE OFFER

Scholars will have opportunities to engage with and learn from members across the Rotary community. Some of the competencies involvement in the scholarship might assist in building include, but are not limited to:

- self confidence
- interpersonal skills,
- social and business etiquette,
- public speaking,
- organising and running meetings,
- leadership,
- project management
- and teamwork.

This learning may be achieved through active involvement in the club, networking events and opportunities to attend leadership programs.

We aim to give scholars the ability to deal effectively with people at all levels of society, by enabling them to work alongside men and women who have already made their mark in business and the community.

HOW DOES IT WORK

Though some exceptions may apply, scholarships are available to individuals who are over 18 and under 25 and are either:

- a current undergraduate or post graduate university student
- a young person in their first full time job earning less than \$60,000p.a.
- a young person seeking employment in their chosen field with a strong passion to serve community
- a young person unable to work and/or are working with a disability earning less than \$60,000p.a.
- a young entrepreneur
- a young aspiring employee under 25 from the sponsoring company.

Awardees in their first year are deemed **Associate Scholars** with the following privileges:

- membership of *Rotary Club of Crawley*,
- the total cost of every formal breakfast/meeting you attend.
- financial support to attend Rotary District events

The Scholarships are available for up to two years or as long as the Scholars still meet the requirements. Continuing support is dependent on the scholars' level of engagement with the club and its projects and is reviewed at regular intervals. At the end of your first year the scholarship committee will discuss with you your involvement to determine next step.

Should you be awarded support for a second year you will become a **Full Scholar** with the same privileges as in your previous year. However, the fundamental difference is that you will become a **Member of Rotary International** with all the rights and privileges afforded to all Rotarians.

Each applicant for the scholarship makes a commitment to attend no less than 50% of our meetings and become involved in our club and its projects. You may be expected to be responsible for some of your own costs, though each individual's situation will be assessed confidentially.

We meet every Thursday at the UWA Club in Crawley. The majority of our meeting are held during breakfast (between 7:00am-8:30am dependent on week) with some dinner/evening events. Project involvement is generally additional to this.

We hope that you are at the beginning of a life-long association with Rotary and the community and look forward to receiving an application from you.
